



Report Recommendations

- 1. Create specific guidelines on gender and Al.
- 2. Establish committees and task forces to lead gender/societal impact assessments.
- 3. Develop gender-sensitive Al standards.
- 4. Invest in efforts that accelerate women's participation in Al.

- For the workshop in KL, around 80 registered participants from Malaysia, Thailand, Lao PDR, Cambodia, Mongolia, Indonesia, Pakistan, Brunei, and Timor Leste.
- Training on "Al Fundamentals" to be organized for civil servants of Bhutan (22-26 September 2025)
- Training on AI standards and technology to be organized for Cambodia (8-10 October 2025)



















3) Findings from the recently completed Al Feasibility Study

Artificial Intelligence adoption in Landlocked Developing countries, Least Developed Countries, and Small Island Developing States



Study findings

- *Overall, the level of government Al-readiness among LDCs, LLDCs, and SIDS in the Asia-Pacific region remains below 50% of the global average.
- * While varying levels of Al maturity exist among LDCs, LLDCs, and SIDS, Bangladesh, Fiji, and Mongolia currently exhibit the highest rates of Al adoption.
- * Al-related policies and governance among LDCs, LLDCs, and SIDS are at various maturity levels.
- Infrastructure (internet connectivity) and human capacity continue to pose significant barriers.


